Handbell and Chimes Concert. It is a reprise of the 2019 concert, with the five handbell and chimes choirs from Rideau Park: Touch of Brass, Grace Notes, La Bell Ensemble, Note-Able Sound, and Ringing Praise, playing the popular and sacred music of Christmas.

Wednesday evenings: December 2, 9, 16 and 23, 7pm - To prepare ourselves for Christmas, a series of online Advent retreats will be held, leading up to Christmas. The Wednesday, December 16, retreat will be a Blue Christmas service: loss, healing and hope.
