Each Sunday morning as the collection plate is passed around, while it may look bare, 198 members/families (over 82% of those making pledges) are actually contributing close to \$7,650 through PreAuthorized Remittance (PAR). Sunday PAR givings go primarily to the 3 major funds, Ministry and Programs, Mission and Service and Property Renewal, which the Church uses to manage most of the work that we do. It takes a lot of financial support, approximately \$13,000 per week, to operate a Church our size and run all of the programs that we do. That is why we need strong financial support from all those attending our services. So when that plate goes by take time to reflect on what it takes to run our church and how your generosity can help make a difference. (Please note numbers have been up-dated from last week's bulletin.)

Please keep in mind worshippers who have limited mobility. Parking in the parking spots beside Cunningham makes it easier for them to come to church, so if you don't have the need, please use a parking spot on the Beecroft side. Thanks.
