2019 Stewardship Update

After one month of the Stewardship campaign we have received a **pledge total** of **\$259,878**. 98 pledges have been received with:

\$95,472 for the Ministries and Programs Fund \$27,598 for the Mission and Service Fund \$27,782 for the Property Renewal Fund \$109,026 for the Greatest Need

In addition there are 116 persons on PAR totaling \$195,633 that have not indicated their pledge and it would be greatly appreciated if the pledge form was returned.
