



Each Sunday morning as the collection plate is passed around, while it may look bare, 198 members/families (over 85% of those making pledges) are actually contributing close to \$8,500 through pre-authorized remittance (PAR). It takes a lot of financial support, approximately \$11,500 per week, to operate a Church our size and run all of the programs that we do.
