

Notes from Council meeting April 24th

- Council is doing a spiritual exercise which involves paying attention to where God is at work in our church right now;
- Dianne Keevil-Harrold was appointed a Trustee for their next meeting;
- Ministry and Personnel will set up a Search Committee for a new custodian, using an updated job description;
- Congregational Development is working with Property Renewal to install and program a digital monitor in the Beecroft lobby;
- Repairs to the Music office will be followed by air quality testing;
- Council decided not to disburse funds available from the Foundation at this time. There
 will be another call for applications in the fall.
- We approved new Terms of Reference for the Douglas Ian Brown Memorial Fund.
- There was discussion about fundraising and funding large projects;
- Council discussed hopes and a timeline for the Strategic Plan working group;
- Next meeting: June 19, 2019.
