TREASURER'S NOTE

Below are the year-to-date revenues and expenses for the period ending November 30, 2019 for the "Rideau Park Ministries and Program" (M&P) Fund, along with comparatives to the current budget for the period and the previous years' actual:

The M&P Fund is our operating fund out of which we pay salaries and other operating expenses during the year. It is not unusual for this fund to be in a deficit position at the end of November. However, as noted above, the M&P Fund is behind last year at this time, primarily due to a decline in envelope givings. We had already planned for a budget shortfall of \$25,000. We are in danger of surpassing this shortfall and therefore, need strong Congregational support over the next month so that we can keep the shortfall to less than or equal to plan in order to maintain our limited reserves.
