Minister's Message


Suddenly, my email inbox has been flooded with a tide of Advent calendars. Is this a sign that we as a society are becoming more spiritual? More intentional about preparing for Christmas in a way that deepens our understanding of what God's incarnation might mean in the world?

Apparently not. Like Christmas itself, Advent seems to have been hijacked by consumerism. Nowadays, you can purchase Advent calendars that reveal nail polish and herbal teas, dog treats and craft beers – all tucked behind numbers from 1 to 25. (Never mind that Advent sometimes starts as early as November 27th – an obscure point known only to church goers.) Most advent calendars are clearly counting down to a big celebration – whether it is spiritual, social or materialistic is up to you.

The Advent scriptures always seem out of step with that joyful Christmas celebration. The prophets wrote in times of war, displacement, injustice and social upheaval. When they speak of hope they are calling for a society that feeds the hungry, cares for the widows and orphans, and beats their swords into

ploughs. The gospels are at their most apocalyptic – it's the end of the world, when the kingdom comes, will your light still be burning bright?

In our own lives, sometimes it is hard to "celebrate" Christmas in a year when we have lost loved ones, or faced economic hardship, or seen the world crumble and burn. It is good to



be reminded that these too are real Advent times, and that Christ was born to remind us of how to care for one another, and look for signs of hope wherever we go.

I have no problem with any of these Advent calendars. If you know me well, you know that, for me, that little chocolate behind a cardboard window is not a bad sign of hope. My daughter Rebekah and I have bought the tea calendar this year, with the understanding that we will discover every flavour together in a tea break that we will share. And maybe that moment together each day will be the only sign of hope we need.

Looking forward to seeing you this Advent, maybe over a cup of tea, a candlelit prayer, or a beautiful concert. Let us be hope for one another.

From the Treasurer, Bob Roden...

During this busy time of year, we need to be reminded of how we are doing financially. This helps to ensure that, through continued generous contributions from members and adherents, we have the necessary resources to provide vibrant programs and support to the congregation and the community at large.

As noted by the overall results below, the Ministries and Programs Fund is behind both the budget and last year at this time. We had already planned for a budget shortfall of \$25,000. We are in danger of surpassing this shortfall. We need the Congregation's support so that we can maintain our small reserves until we can start implementing the Strategic Planning Group's report recommendations, which is not likely to happen until sometime in 2021.

We do recognize that there are many extra financial demands at this time of year, such as Christmas Cheer, the food bank and other charitable causes, and we thank you for considering additional financial support over the remaining two months of the year.
