Minister's Message

We need more than patience...we need hope

It seems as though we spend our lives waiting. I read that, annually, the average person spends 13 hours on hold for customer service, 38 hours stuck in traffic and 146 hours waiting for friends who are late, delayed trains and late deliveries. Over the course of a lifespan, six months are spent waiting for a red light to turn green and at least three years waiting in line. Then comes COVID-19.

For the past 20 months we've been waiting for the pandemic to be over. Personally, I can't wait to sing hymns in church, join my fellow Rideau Parkers for Coffee and Conversation in Beecroft, and see Iain sing without a mask (although, fortunately, his marvellous voice comes through with one). I can't wait to see my grandchildren sitting on the floor listening to Elizabeth or Steve during Children's Time, singing in the junior choir, playing teen bells. I can't wait for in-person meetings with my UCW unit and the return of those wonderful church suppers. Yet wait I must.

When COVID first appeared, we thought it would be over in a matter of months. Some of us were expecting church activities to get back to normal in September – September of 2020, that is. But the pandemic dragged on. There was *good news* – vaccines became available. Surely COVID would be over once everyone received their second dose. Global pandemics and personal crises notwithstanding, the resiliency of the human spirit continues to amaze me.

UCW Update

had the privilege of acting as Bazaar Convenor this year, although my last year as Convenor should have been 2020. But that's COVID for you. Putting things on hold, cancelling events, making everyone, everywhere, scramble. "Pivot" sounds so much more intentional and dignified than scramble, so I'll say that both the UCW Executive and the bazaar convenors' committee pivoted their hearts out this last while.

Again, because of COVID, we held a hybrid bazaar this fall: one part an outdoor Mini-Bazaar on September 25 and the second part an online Food Bazaar, the first week of November. Both events exceeded expectations. Our Mini-Bazaar in September raised \$5,837, including some generous donations; our November event raised \$6,538, including more donations and after expenses. This is a total of **\$12,375**. We did really well, despite COVID-related limitations; for instance, this figure is more than half of what is usually raised from our traditional bazaar, but



we raised it without advertising in the Ottawa Citizen, and with about a third of the items we usually sell.

It would be an oversight, however, to focus solely on the funds raised for our charitable giving at year-end. The biggest reason why these two fund-raisers were successful is the Rideau Park congregation (and its friends). It was a joy to see dedicated volunteers working really hard but very contentedly at both of these events, and an even greater joy to see familiar faces come to shop or pick up their purchases. The warmth and relief in our eyes and body language were wonderful. Obviously, we couldn't see each other's smiles through our masks, but we could feel them.

Special thanks to organizers John Durkee and Nancy Begg-Durkee, Heather and Wayne Bennett, Sue Davidson, Cathy Hollands, Heather Ingrams, Christel Kurz, Judy Paré, Bob Roden, Elaine Robertson, Lisa Sadler and Ruth Scobie. All of you stepped up and thought outside the box. Your commitment and creativity do you great credit. The website for the online bazaar will stay in my memory for a long time! Also, my thanks to our custodian, Geoff Scollick, for his support and patience for receiving directions that often reversed as I pivoted, so to speak, on the set-up days in November.

Turning to other UCW business, the Memorial Fund presently has a balance of \$9,324 and the General Fund has \$20,121. Lisa Sadler has been emailing UCW members for their input on spending the Memorial Fund monies. A number of us have expressed a desire to have donations directed toward more environmentally-dedicated issues.
